

SAFEGUARDING THE PPWR INTERNAL MARKET LEGAL BASIS

Brussels, March 2023

- Joint industry statement to
 - support maintaining the PPWR proposal's internal market legal basis and legal instrument, and
 - □ advocate for a resilient EU single market and strengthened market for secondary materials to enable the circular economy.
- The statement will be circulated to the PCF after this call.
- Invitation to co-sign by Friday 24 March end of play.

RE: Safeguarding the Internal Market Legal Basis of the Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation to obtain best possible outcomes

The undersigned industry associations express their strong support for the European Union's ambitions for a circular economy, namely the EU Commission proposal to transform Directive 94/62/EC on Packaging and Packaging Waste (PPWD) into a Regulation and the choice to maintain an internal market legal basis (Article 114 TFEU).

While this is a welcome step forward, we are writing to express our concern about the potential erosion or split of the Regulation's legal basis as part of the co-decision process.

A robust EU single market is key to preserving the free movement of packaging raw materials and packaged goods. Packaging is an essential part of a product supply chain, from the production to the consumption stage, and the packaging value chain plays a central role in contributing to a resource-efficient and circular economy. For instance, by optimising resource use, minimising product and food waste and by protecting products all along the value chain.

Additionally, ensuring that packaging waste is duly collected and makes its way into recycling allows valuable raw materials to come back in the value chain. A strengthened market for secondary materials and a strong and resilient EU single market represent fundamental enablers of circularity, which will create greater economies of scale and underpin the investment needed to realise a circular and climate-neutral economy in Europe. Its continued functioning remains crucial to Europe's global competitiveness and green transition.

EUROPEN THEMATIC PRIORITIES

Recyclability

- EC standardisation request by 1 Jan. 2025 for establishment of D4R criteria
- Recyclability requirements to EiF* from 5 years after the EiF of the standards (and in any case no earlier than 2030/2035)
- Presumption of compliance to apply in case of delay with the adoption of standards
- Simplification of criteria defining 'recyclable packaging' and corresponding timelines
- Clarification of 'recyclability at scale' requirements

Recycled content

- Targets to be calculated as an average of the plastic packaging placed on the Union market by a producer
- Additional derogations to be assessed by 31 Dec. 2025
- Assessment to be based on market availability and prices of recycled plastics considering Eurostat data, as well as on the uptake of new recycling technologies
- Amendment of RC targets by means of an urgency procedure

Waste prevention

- Objectives of Article 9 and Article 21 to be achieved by 1 Jan. 2030
- Removal of 40% maximum empty space ratio and packaging minimisation to be pursued subject to the performance criteria listed in Part I of Annex IV
- Deletion of Article 22 and Annex V

Reuse

- Deletion of 2040 reuse targets
- Assessment of new possible targets by 1 Jan. 2030 or at the latest when carrying out the revision of the Regulation
- Reuse requirements for transport packaging (paragraphs 12 and 13) to apply from 1 Jan. 2030 and made aspirational
